At the WFFM General Assembly in May 2025, the WFFM executive committee was encouraged to establish working groups to support its evolution. Four working groups were proposed and are now established. Still room for more members' participation.

On behalf of the executive committee, first VP René Faure and Anne Asserson, Secretary General, had a kick-off Zoom meeting and have started the groups.

Each group has a relevant mandate with an action plan. This has been formed and agreed upon after the first meeting. WFFM wants the group to work individually and present their recommendations in an interim report towards the end of the year. The final report, with recommendations, will be presented at the GA in Athens.

22 persons representing 12 countries are participating in the four different groups.

Update on Young Council

I Feedback from different national Young Friends groups

France: Eugénie will step down from her position as national coordinator of the Young Friends at the end of September but will remain active as a volunteer. She will be replaced by Romane, who will also take part in the upcoming meetings in Athens.

Portugal: Their General Assembly will be held this month, with around ten young friends expected to attend. Travel costs remain a challenge, which limits broader participation.

Canada: Several meetings and workshops are being organized, particularly as a follow-up to the work launched in Naples. A new coordinator has recently taken office.

Germany: Young friends will meet in November. Mannheim (Germany): The Young Friends will celebrate their 12th anniversary.

England: The GA will take place in October in Bristol, one of their main priorities is to develop the Young Friends.

II- Interactive map project



Following the decision in Naples,
Eugénie and Sixtine have been in
contact with the person managing
the World Federation's website.
They reviewed several tools (both
free and paid) and decided, for now,
to use uMap (OpenStreetMap),
which is simple and user-friendly.
Links to other possible platforms
were also shared for feedback.

Sixtine presented a first draft of the map with examples already filled in for France and Portugal.

The map will include, for each country, the following elements (each representative is free to provide the information they wish): - A short description of how the Young Friends group operates (structure, specific features, local engagement, etc.) - A contact email address (personal, general, or created for this purpose, as long as it is checked regularly) - Links to social media accounts or websites - One or more photos representing the group or its activities (optional) - Languages spoken by the contact person(s) - The age range of members in sections - The year the section was created

Representatives are encouraged to send their contributions as soon as possible, to move forward with the map project. Once the map is set up, each country will be able to update its own information to ensure it stays current.
